Thank you for joining us on the Andy Mort Tour

Your Start Number is based off the seeded entry list which can be downloaded through the link on the 2300 Club website or directly at www.rallies.info

Your Start Time is determined by your Start Number, Car No. 1 Starts at 09:31 Subsequent cars start at 1-minute intervals, i.e., Car 10 Starts at 09:40 etc.

Please ensure that you have sufficient fuel in your vehicle when you arrive at the Start at West Bradford Village Hall, Grindleton Road. BB7 4TE (Map. Ref. 103/748448). There is only one fuel station on route.

Start Formalities

The Start Venue will be open from 08:00 until 11:00 and re-open at approx. 16:00 Buffet due to be available from 17:00

The space on the Village Hall car park is very limited and as such, we ask that anyone who is bringing a second vehicle is to park it on the spectators car park on the Horner Shearing Car Park at Laneside Farm, BB7 4QH – Map Ref: 103/749448 or What3Words ///dote.list.factored – This car park will be open from 07:00 till 19:00

It is recommended that you arrive at the Start Venue at least one hour before your start time. Firstly, after arrival, please park as instructed by the marshals within the entrants car park, as shown on the start venue plan. The Club Scrutineer will have opportunity to observe cars and carry out an inspection if it is thought necessary.

There is no signing on this year in the Hall as you will already have signed on via www.rallies.info online. However, you will still need to go into the Hall to collect your pack containing:

A Number Plate (to be placed, forward facing in a prominent position, inside or outside the car)

Two Numbered stickers (to be placed in a prominent position on either side of the car ie. Rear Side Windows)

Road Book or Route by Map Ref. If you want both, please advise Stuart Pye asap.

Meal Vouchers for Breakfast, Lunch and Evening meals.

Event Starters

This year, we have the honour of cars will be flagged away by the Mayor of Ribble Valley, Cllr Louise Edge

Please be ready to start at your designated Start Time from the Gazebo at the exit of the car park.

Driving Standards Judges of Fact

Any reports of driving standards below the standard expected, reported by any Judge of Fact will be passed to the Clerk of the Course. The Clerk of the Course may then instruct the marshal at the next manned position not to return the entrants Route Check Record Card, so they can no longer continue on the event. A list of Judges of Fact are attached to these Final Instructions.

Route Notes

On the route not every junction is indicated. The correct route follows the obvious "main" road until the inter. mileage from the previous instruction has been completed. You should then be at a junction which agrees with the next instruction.

Whilst following the route you will find that certain points are designated as "Check Points". These will be

either unmanned or manned. At the unmanned Check Points, you will find a board bearing code letters/numbers, these must be recorded in the appropriate space on your Check Point Record Card. At manned Check Points the marshal will check that you have not arrived too early. If you are too early, the marshal will hold on to your card until your due time. The marshal will place a tick in the appropriate box on your route check record card and allow you on your way.

Check Points will have a 'What 3 Words' reference. Should you lose your way, you can use this reference to help get you back on route. **You will need to download the What 3 Words App!**

At the finish of the Run all entrants with a "Full House" on their Check Point Record Cards will be entered in a prize draw for various awards.

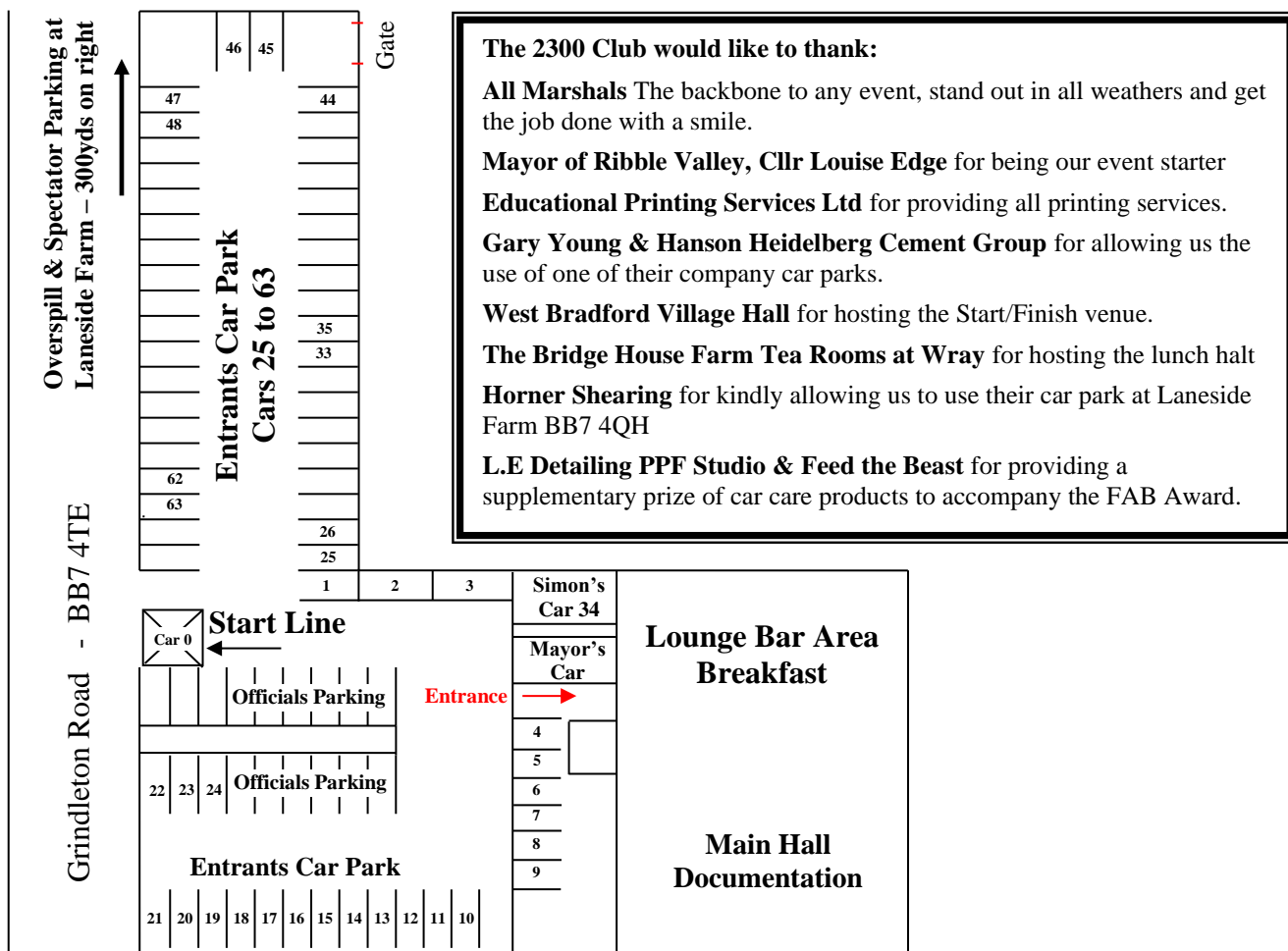

The Code

- **Drive at a Comfortable Pace**
Please drive at a pace you are comfortable with and obey the Road Traffic Act, especially on narrow roads with limited visibility. Remember, this is not a race, but an opportunity to savour the drive.
- **Let Others Pass When Safe**
If another car is behind you and wishes to pass, please allow them to do so when it's safe. This helps everyone enjoy the journey without unnecessary delays.
- **Be Mindful of Pedestrians and Other Road Users**
Slow down to a walking pace when you encounter pedestrians, dog walkers, or groups of people on narrow roads. Your courtesy will be greatly appreciated.
- **Show Patience with Horse Riders and Cyclists**
When you see horse riders or cyclists slow down and wait for them to signal that it's safe to pass. A little patience goes a long way in ensuring everyone's safety.
- **Respect Farm Areas**
When driving through farmyards or agricultural areas, please reduce your speed to 20 mph or less. Remember that these are work areas with livestock, and we're guests here.
- **Be Polite and Respectful**
A smile and a wave can make all the difference. Please be courteous to marshals, officials, fellow entrants, and the general public. Reports of disrespectful behaviour may result in you being refused entry to future events.
